## **Articulation Agreement**

This agreement is applicable to student who complete the required hours for the associate of applied science degree in Human Services Technology from Richmond Community College and transfer to the University of North Carolina at Pembroke and major in Sociology. Transfers who have not completed the associate degree will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis. Regardless of hours transferred, students must satisfy all UNC Pembroke degree requirements for the Sociology major from the University of North Carolina at Pembroke, including taking at least two SOC elective courses at the 4000 level.
