Direct Transfer Agreement between Louisburg College, Louisburg, NC and University of North Carolina at Pembroke, Pembroke, NC

Purpose

The purpose of this articulation agreement is to facilitate the continuation of undergraduate study for students who have completed an associate's degree at Louisburg College and wish to complete a Bachelor's degree at University of North Carolina at Pembroke (UNCP).

Financial Awards

Accepted transfer students holding an AA/AS from Louisburg may qualify for merit awards through UNCP Admissions. Eligibility is based on a minimum GPA of at least 3.4. Merit awards may only be granted to NC residents and to those students enrolling in the Fall term.

Period of Performance

The current agreement will begin in Spring, 2017 and will continue indefinitely or until it is modified or terminated.

Modification or Termination

Any changes or additions to the agreement shall be made after consultation with the proper official of both institutions. This agreement may be modified or terminated by either party through written communication provided with at least one year advance notice.

Transfer Admission Requirements

Required of the Louisburg College transfer student are the following:

- 1. The student must complete a UNCP transfer application and submit an official Louisburg College transcript and a satisfactory recommendation from Louisburg College's academic dean. The online application fee will be waived.
- 2. Priority in admissions will be given to Louisburg College transfer students applying to The University of North Carolina at Pembroke on or before May 15th of the academic year prior to date of entrance.
- 3. The student must have met all graduation requirements of Louisburg College and provide a final Louisburg College transcript and official transcripts from any other college from which credits are used to meet graduation requirements prior to enrolling at The University of North Carolina at Pembroke.

- 4. All academic credits earned at Louisburg College will be accepted at full value. UNC Pembroke does not limit the number of transfer credits in which a student can transfer; however, a minimum of 25% of the semester hours needed for this degree must be completed in residence at UNC Pembroke. Please refer to UNCP's specific degree requirement for business majors. A course equivalency chart is attached to this document.
- 5. Only courses with a grade of "C" or higher will be accepted for transfer credit.
- 6. The student will matriculate with all privileges and benefits available to students enrolled at UNCP including financial aid, student government leadership, academic transfer honors, and social organizations.
- 7. Qualified faculty members must teach all courses accepted for transfer to The University of North Carolina at Pembroke. Faculty teaching courses for transfer must meet the standards set forth in **Principles for Accreditation**, section 3.7.1 by the Southern Association of Colleges and School.

Upon signing this document by the designated officials of each institution, either college is free to implement this agreement as it deems proper.
