The **MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU)** is made on the 13th day of February, 2017, by and between The University of North Carolina at Pembroke (UNCP) and Richmond Community College (Richmond CC).

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the parties to this MOU desire to collaborate to establish a degree completion program serving students enrolled in the Associate in Arts degree program with interests in Elementary Education careers. Upon completion of the Associate in Arts degree, students may pursue the Bachelor of Science (B.S.) Degree in Elementary Education at UNCP.

WHEREAS, Richmond CC prepares students for successful careers and educational futures through diverse Associate Degree programs. Community Colleges attract students with interests in education and provide them with educational opportunities related to elementary education, although the diversity of available degree programs is limited.

The Elementary Education Partnership program will prepare students for successful career, and educational futures through a complete integration of knowledge and skills acquired from Richmond CC and UNCP.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties to this MOU mutually agree as follows:

- 1. Students enrolled at Richmond CC receive:
 - Upon completion of all requirements, an Associate Degree from Richmond CC.
 - Early identification to UNCP that the student is interested in the B.S. in Elementary Education degree.
 - Access to specialized advising by designated advisors at Richmond CC and UNCP to ensure students select courses to minimize their time to degree completion and optimize academic achievement.
- 2. UNCP Transfer Admissions Requirements:
 - The student must complete a UNCP transfer application and submit an official Richmond CC transcript.

- The student must have met all graduation requirements of Richmond CC and provide a final Richmond CC transcript and official transcripts from any other college from which credits are used to meet graduation requirements prior to enrolling at The University of North Carolina at Pembroke.
- UNC Pembroke does not limit the number of transfer credits in which a student can transfer; however, a minimum of 25% of the semester hours needed for this degree must be completed in residence at UNC Pembroke. Please refer to UNCP's specific degree requirement for business majors. A course equivalency chart is attached to this document.
- 3. UNCP Elementary Education Admission Requirements:
 - Students apply to UNCP by submitting the UNCP undergraduate transfer application and official transcripts from high school, Richmond CC, and any other colleges or universities attended.
 - Students must complete the Associate in Arts degree program with a minimum grade point average of 2.7 on a 4.0 scale on all prior college/university course work.
 - Meet the state established scores on Praxis Core, SAT, or ACT. An official copy of the scores
 must be sent to UNCP. Students must meet the scores in effect at the time they apply to and
 qualify for admission to the Teacher Education Program. Official score reports must be sent to
 the UNCP School of Education licensure office. Praxis Core Academic Skills for Educators
 passing test scores: reading 156, writing 162,
 - math 150; or a combined score of 468. OR
 - SAT score of 1100 or ACT combined score of 24 you do NOT have to take any of the PRAXIS Core tests.
 - SAT math score of 550 or ACT math score of 24 you do NOT have to take the PRAXIS math test.
 - SAT verbal score of 550 or ACT English test score of 24 you do NOT have to take the PRAXIS reading or writing tests.
 - Students will be eligible for Teacher Education Admission after satisfactorily completing all requirements and a Teacher Education admission interview.
- 4. Richmond CC graduates with the Associate of Arts degree accepted into UNCP receive:
 - Eligibility of scholarships and financial aid, subject to financial aid eligibility requirements.
 - Access to Richmond CC library, advising, and classroom resources through the duration of the student's program.
 - Access to the resources at UNCP (library, advising, etc.) upon identification as a student in the Bachelor of Science in Elementary of Education program.
- 5. Qualified faculty members must teach all courses accepted for transfer to The University of North Carolina at Pembroke. Faculty teaching courses for transfer must meet the standards set forth in **Principles for Accreditation**, section 3.7.1 by the Southern Association of Colleges and School.

This MOU may be revised when mutually acceptable and as necessary. The undersigned support the MOU between Richmond CC and UNC Pembroke.
